A BILL

For the relief of Irina Kotlova-Green and her son, Nikita
Kotlov.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
6 1101 et seq.), Irina Kotlova-Green and her son, Nikita
7 Kotlov, shall be held and considered to have been lawfully
8 admitted to the United States for permanent residence as
9 of the date of enactment of this Act upon payment of the
10 required visa fees.

1 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Irina
3 Kotlova-Green and her son, Nikita Kotlov, as provided in
4 section 1, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper
5 officer to reduce by the appropriate number during the
6 current fiscal year the total number of immigrant visas
7 available to natives of the country of the aliens' birth
8 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality
9 Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
