## **3** SECTION 1. CEILING FANS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi5 sion of law, ceiling fans classified under subheading
6 8414.51.00 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
7 United States imported from Thailand shall enter duty8 free and without any quantitative limitations, if duty-free
9 treatment under title V of the Trade Act of 1974 (19)

U.S.C. 2461 et seq.) would have applied to such entry had
 the competitive need limitation been waived under section
 503(d) of such Act.

4 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The provisions of this section
5 shall apply to ceiling fans described in subsection (a) that
6 are entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for
7 consumption—

8 (1) on or after the date that is 15 days after9 the date of enactment of this Act; and

10 (2) before July 30, 2003.
