A BILL

To provide for the preservation and restoration of historic buildings and structures at historically black colleges and universities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF HISTORIC BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES AT HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES.

Title V of the Omnibus Parks and Public Lands
Management Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–333; 1110

Stat. 4153) is amended by striking section 507 and insert-

1	"SEC. 507. PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF HIS
2	TORIC BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES AT HIS
3	TORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNIVER
4	SITIES.
5	"(a) Purposes.—The purposes of this section are—
6	"(1) to identify historic buildings and struc-
7	tures at historically black colleges and universities
8	that are in need of preservation and restoration; and
9	"(2) to provide grants to historically black col-
10	leges and universities to preserve and restore those
11	buildings and structures.
12	"(b) Definitions.—In this section:
13	"(1) HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE OR UNI-
14	VERSITY.—The term 'historically black college or
15	university' has the meaning given the term 'part B
16	institution' in section 322 of the Higher Education
17	Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1061).
18	"(2) Historic building or structure.—The
19	term 'historic building or structure' means a build-
20	ing or structure listed, or eligible to be listed, on the
21	National Register of Historic Places.
22	"(3) Secretary.—The term 'Secretary' means
23	the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
24	rector of the National Park Service.
25	"(c) Establishment.—The Secretary shall estab-
26	lish a program to provide for the preservation and restora-

- 1 tion of historic buildings and structures at historically
- 2 black colleges and universities.
- 3 "(d) Assessment.—Not later than 1 year after the
- 4 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, through the
- 5 National Trust for Historic Preservation, shall—
- 6 "(1) assess all historic buildings and structures
- 7 located at historically black colleges and universities;
- 8 "(2) obtain an independent estimate of the
- 9 complete cost of restoring, renovating, or rehabili-
- tating the historic buildings or structures (including
- the cost of compliance with applicable laws (includ-
- ing regulations) relating to handicapped access to
- the buildings or structures); and
- 14 "(3) determine the fiscal capacity of each his-
- torically black college or university to complete the
- restoration, renovation, or rehabilitation of the his-
- toric buildings and structures, including the ability
- of the historically black college or university to pro-
- vide the non-Federal share under subsection (f)(1).

- 21 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Not less often than once
- each fiscal year, the Secretary shall award not less
- than 15 grants to historically black colleges and uni-
- versities to pay the Federal share of the cost of re-
- storing, renovating, or rehabilitating historic build-

1	ings and structures located on the campuses of his-
2	torically black colleges and universities.
3	"(2) Amount.—
4	"(A) In general.—The amount of a
5	grant under paragraph (1) shall be equal to the
6	difference between—
7	"(i) the amount required to restore,
8	renovate, or rehabilitate the historic build-
9	ing or structure; and
10	"(ii) unless the non-Federal share is
11	waived under subsection (f)(2), the amount
12	of the non-Federal share required under
13	subsection $(f)(1)$.
14	"(B) Limitation.—The amount of a
15	grant determined under subparagraph (A) shall
16	not exceed the cost of completing the restora-
17	tion, renovation, or rehabilitation of a historic
18	building or structure.
19	"(3) Considerations.—In awarding grants
20	under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall consider,
21	based on the assessment under subsection (d), the
22	relative severity of the threat to the historic value
23	and status of the historic building or structure,
24	including—

1	"(A) the extent of the physical deteriora-
2	tion of the historic building or structure be-
3	cause of lack of use or inadequate maintenance;
4	"(B) the demand for use of the historic
5	building or structure, or the land on which the
6	historic building or structure is located, because
7	of—
8	"(i) encroachment from the sur-
9	rounding community; or
10	"(ii) the need to expand the campus
11	of the historically black college or univer-
12	sity; and
13	"(C) the extent of the lack of resources
14	necessary to assess the need for, and to pay the
15	cost of, restoration, renovation, or rehabilitation
16	of historic buildings or structures located on the
17	campus of the historically black college or uni-
18	versity.
19	"(4) Conditions.—As a condition of the re-
20	ceipt of a grant for a historic building or structure
21	under paragraph (1), a grant recipient shall agree—
22	"(A) that, for a period of time specified by
23	the Secretary—

1	"(i) no alteration shall be made to the
2	historic building or structure without the
3	approval of the Secretary;
4	"(ii) reasonable public access to the
5	historic building or structure restored, ren-
6	ovated, or rehabilitated using grant funds
7	shall be permitted by the grant recipient
8	for interpretive and educational purposes;
9	and
10	"(iii) the grant recipient shall not re-
11	ceive any other funds under the National
12	Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470
13	et seq.); and
14	"(B) to provide the non-Federal share re-
15	quired under subsection $(f)(1)$ unless the re-
16	quirement is waived under subsection $(f)(2)$.
17	"(f) Cost Sharing.—
18	"(1) Non-federal share.—The non-federal
19	share of the cost of a project to restore, renovate,
20	or rehabilitate a historic building or structure under
21	this section shall be 30 percent.
22	"(2) Waiver.—
23	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In a case in which the
24	historically black college or university does not
25	have an endowment or has an endowment of

less than \$50,000,000, the Secretary shall waive the non-Federal share required under paragraph (1).

"(B) APPLICABILITY.—Subparagraph (A) shall apply to any grant provided to a historically black college or university under this section after November 12, 1996.

"(g) Funding.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Of funds of the Historic Preservation Fund established by section 108 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470h), \$60,000,000 shall be made available to the Secretary to carry out this section for fiscal year 2003 and each fiscal year thereafter.

"(2) ALLOCATION.—Of amounts made available under paragraph (1) for a fiscal year, the Secretary shall make a grant to each historically black college or university, in order of priority based on the assessment under subsection (d), in an amount determined under subsection (e)(2)."

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
