A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to modify the terms of the community disaster loan program, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Disaster
- 5 Loan Equity Act of 2002".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that—
- 8 (1) major disasters, including disasters caused
- 9 by terrorist acts, often result in a decline in eco-

1	nomic activity in areas affected by the disaster and
2	a reduction in tax collections by State and local gov-
3	ernments serving those areas;
4	(2) a report of the General Accounting Office
5	entitled "Review of the Estimates for the Impact of
6	the September 11, 2001, Terrorist Attacks on New
7	York Tax Revenues", dated July 26, 2002, esti-
8	mates that—
9	(A) for fiscal year 2002, tax revenue losses
10	for New York City will be \$1,600,000,000 and
11	tax revenue losses for the State of New York
12	will be \$1,600,000,000; and
13	(B) for fiscal year 2003, tax revenue losses
14	for New York City will be \$1,400,000,000 and
15	tax revenue losses for the State of New York
16	will be \$4,200,000,000;
17	(3) as a result of the major disaster caused by
18	terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the City of
19	New York also experienced substantial additional
20	unreimbursed disaster-related expenses of
21	\$650,000,000;
22	(4) under the community disaster loan program
23	(in this section referred to as the "CDL program"),
24	as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster

Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, the President

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- may make loans to a local government suffering a substantial loss of tax and other revenues as a result of a major disaster, if the local government demonstrates a need for financial assistance in order to preform its governmental function;
 - (5) the President may cancel the repayment of all or any part of a loan made to a local government under the CDL program if revenues following the disaster are insufficient to meet the operating budget of that local government as a result of disasterrelated revenue losses and additional unreimbursed disaster-related municipal operating expenses;
 - (6) in the case of a major disaster resulting from a terrorist attack, repayment of interest or principal on a loan made under the CDL program should not be required;
 - (7) assistance made available under the CDL program is often instrumental in aiding the full recovery of a local government following a major disaster;
 - (8) section 207 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (Public Law 106–390; 114 Stat. 1571) established, for the first time, a \$5,000,000 limitation on loans made to a local government under the CDL program in connection with a major disaster; and

1	(9) the \$5,000,0000 limitation is inequitable
2	when applied to a local government serving a largely
3	populated area, such as New York City, and is in-
4	consistent with the objective of the CDL program to
5	provide meaningful assistance to a local government
6	recovering from a major disaster.
7	SEC. 3. COMMUNITY DISASTER LOANS.
8	(a) Amendments.—Section 417 of the Robert T.
9	Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
10	(42 U.S.C. 5184) is amended—
11	(1) by striking "local government" each place it
12	appears and inserting "State or local government";
13	(2) in subsection (b)—
14	(A) by striking "based on need, shall" and
15	inserting "based on need and shall"; and
16	(B) by striking ", and shall not exceed
17	\$5,000,000''; and
18	(3) by adding at the end the following:
19	"(e) Major Disasters Caused by Terrorist At-
20	TACKS.—The President shall not require the payment of
21	any interest or principal on a loan made under this section
22	to a State or local government which suffers a substantial
23	loss of tax and other revenues as a result of a major dis-
24	aster caused by a terrorist attack.".

- 1 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by this
- 2 section shall apply with respect to any major disaster oc-

3 curring on or after October 30, 2000.

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
