A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Agriculture to conduct a study of the effectiveness of silver-based biocides as an alternative treatment to preserve wood.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wood Preservation
- 5 Safety Act of 2002".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that—
- 8 (1) the Environmental Protection Agency, the
- 9 chemical industry, and the home improvement indus-
- try have negotiated a voluntary agreement to phase

1	out the use of arsenic-based preservatives in pres-
2	sure treated wood by December 31, 2003;
3	(2) in order to maintain the wood treatment in-
4	dustry in the United States, a suitable, safe alter-
5	native must be produced;
6	(3) silver has great potential as a viable, safe
7	and cost-effective alternative as a wood preservative
8	(4) silver has been used since ancient times as
9	a treatment to prevent the spread of bacteria;
10	(5) today, silver-based biocides are used in a
11	wide range of applications;
12	(6) in 2001, silver was commercially produced
13	in 12 States (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado
14	Idaho, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico
15	South Dakota, Utah, and Washington), and silver is
16	a readily available material; and
17	(7) the properties of silver biocide need to be
18	further studied to determine the effectiveness of its
19	use as a wood preservative.
20	SEC. 3. STUDY OF SILVER IS A BIOCIDE.
21	The Secretary of Agriculture shall direct the Forest
22	Products Laboratory in Madison, Wisconsin, to conduct
