## A BILL

To authorize the Pyramid of Remembrance Foundation to establish a memorial in the District of Columbia and its environs to honor members of the Armed Forces of the United States who have lost their lives during peacekeeping operations, humanitarian efforts, training, terrorist attacks, or covert operations.

- 3 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.
- 4 In this Act:

(1) MAP.—The term "map" means the map re-1 2 ferred to in section 2(e) of the Commemorative 3 Works Act (40 U.S.C. 1002(e)). (2) Memorial.—The term "memorial" means 5 the memorial authorized to be established under sec-6 tion 2(a). 7 SEC. 2. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH MEMORIAL. 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Pyramid of Remembrance Foundation may establish a memorial on Federal land in the area depicted on the map as "Area II" to honor mem-10 bers of the Armed Forces of the United States who have lost their lives during peacekeeping operations, humanitarian efforts, training, terrorist attacks, or covert operations. 14 15 (b) Compliance With Standards for Commemo-16 RATIVE WORKS.— 17 (1) In General.—Except as provided in para-18 graph (2), the establishment of the memorial shall 19 be in accordance with the Commemorative Works 20 Act (40 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.). (2) Exception.—Subsections (b) and (c) of 21 22 section 3 of the Commemorative Works Act (40 23 U.S.C. 1003) shall not apply to the establishment of

the memorial.

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## 1 SEC. 3. FUNDS FOR MEMORIAL.

2	(a) Use of Federal Funds Prohibited.—Except
3	as provided by the Commemorative Works Act (40 U.S.C.
4	1001 et seq.), no Federal funds may be used to pay any
5	expense incurred from the establishment of the memorial.
6	(b) Deposit of Excess Funds.—The Pyramid of
7	Remembrance Foundation shall transmit to the Secretary
8	of the Treasury for deposit in the account provided for
9	in section 8(b)(1) of the Commemorative Works Act (40
10	U.S.C. 1008(b)(1))—
11	(1) any funds that remain after payment of all
12	expenses incurred from the establishment of the me-
13	morial (including payment of the amount for mainte-
14	nance and preservation required under section 8(b)
15	of the Commemorative Works Act (40 U.S.C.
16	1008(b))); or
17	(2) any funds that remain on expiration of the
18	authority for the memorial under section 10(b) of
19	that Act (40 U.S.C. 1010(b)).

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
