A BILL

For the relief of Jim K. Yoshida.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. VETERAN STATUS.
- 4 (a) Entitlement to Status.—Notwithstanding
- 5 any other provision of law, Jim K. Yoshida of Honolulu,
- 6 Hawaii, is deemed to be a veteran for the purposes of all
- 7 laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
- 8 (b) Treatment of Service.—Notwithstanding any
- 9 other provision of law, the service of Jim K. Yoshida of
- 10 Honolulu, Hawaii, as a volunteer member of the United
- 11 States Army during the period beginning on July 2, 1950,
- 12 and ending on January 17, 1951, shall be deemed to be

- 1 active military service from which Jim K. Yoshida was dis-
- 2 charged under honorable conditions for the purposes of
- 3 all laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.
- 4 (c) Prospective Applicability.—No benefits may
- 5 be paid or otherwise provided to Jim K. Yoshida of Hono-
- 6 lulu, Hawaii, by reason of the enactment of this Act with
- 7 respect to any period before the date of the enactment of
