7	(a) In General.—Section 1861(cc)(2)(E) of the So-
8	cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. $1395x(cc)(2)(E)$) is amended
9	by striking "physician" and inserting "physician, except
10	that a patient receiving qualified psychologist services (as
11	defined in subsection (ii)) may be under the care of a clin-
12	ical psychologist with respect to such services to the extent
13	permitted under State law and except that a patient re-
14	ceiving clinical social worker services (as defined in sub-
15	section (hh)(2)) may be under the care of a clinical social
16	worker with respect to such services to the extent per-
17	mitted under State law".
18	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
19	subsection (a) shall apply to services provided on or after
20	January 1, 2002.
