Mr. ALLEN (for himself, Mr. WARNER, Mr. HELMS, Mr. SPECTER, Mr. BROWNBACK, Mrs. FEINSTEIN, and Mr. HUTCHINSON) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Gao Zhan.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATURALIZATION OF GAO ZHAN.**

4 (a) NATURALIZATION.—Notwithstanding any other
5 provision of law, the Attorney General shall naturalize Gao
6 Zhan as a citizen of the United States, without her being
7 administered the oath of renunciation and allegiance pur-
8 suant to section 337(a) of the Immigration and Nation-
9 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1448(a)), not later than 5 days after
10 the date of the enactment of this Act.

1 (b) CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION.—Not later
2 than 5 days after the date of naturalization under para-
3 graph (1), an appropriate official of the United States
4 Government designated by the Attorney General shall de-
5 liver to Gao Zhan a certificate of naturalization prepared
6 by the Attorney General. If the Attorney General deter-
7 mines that delivery of the certificate of naturalization can-
8 not be made within the period specified, the Attorney shall
9 furnish the certificate to Gao Zhan's spouse, Xue
10 Donghua, on her behalf.
