**A BILL**

To require coverage for colorectal cancer screenings.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.**

4 (a) **SHORT TITLE.**—This Act may be cited as the  
5 “~~Eliminate Colorectal Cancer Act of 2001~~”.

1       (b) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds the following:

2           (1) Colorectal cancer is the second leading  
3       cause of cancer deaths in the United States for men  
4       and women combined.

5           (2) It is estimated that in 2001, 135,400 new  
6       cases of colorectal cancer will be diagnosed in men  
7       and women in the United States.

8           (3) Colorectal cancer is expected to kill 56,700  
9       individuals in the United States in 2001.

10          (4) The adoption of a healthy lifestyle at a  
11       young age can significantly reduce the risk of devel-  
12       oping colorectal cancer.

13          (5) Appropriate screenings and regular tests,  
14       can save large numbers of lives by leading to earlier  
15       identification of colorectal cancer.

16          (6) The Centers for Disease Control and Pre-  
17       vention, the Health Care Financing Administration,  
18       and the National Cancer Institute have initiated the  
19       Screen for Life Campaign targeted to individuals  
20       age 50 and older to spread the message of the im-  
21       portance of colorectal cancer screening tests.

22          (7) Education helps to inform the public of  
23       symptoms for the early detection of colorectal cancer  
24       and methods of prevention.
