A BILL

To prohibit the provision of Federal funds to any State or local educational agency that distributes or provides morning-after pills to schoolchildren.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Schoolchildren's
- 5 Health Protection Act".

1 SEC. 2. SCHOOLCHILDREN'S HEALTH PROTECTION.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 3 sion of law (including the specific provisions described in
- 4 subsection (b)), no funds made available through the De-
- 5 partment of Education shall be provided to any State or
- 6 local educational agency that distributes or provides
- 7 postcoital emergency contraception, or distributes or pro-
- 8 vides a prescription for postcoital emergency contracep-
- 9 tion, to an unemancipated minor, on the premises or in
- 10 the facilities of any elementary school or secondary school.
- 11 (b) Specific Provisions.—The specific provisions
- 12 referred to in subsection (a) are section 330 and title X
- 13 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254b, 300
- 14 et seq.) and title V and XIX of the Social Security Act
- 15 (42 U.S.C. 701 et seq., 1396 et seq.).

- 22 (2) Unemancipated minor.—The term
- "unemancipated minor" means an unmarried indi-
- vidual who is 17 years of age or younger and is a
- dependent, as defined in section 152(a) of the Inter-
