SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL
GROUNDS FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW
ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.
On June 4, 2004, or on such other date as the Speak-
er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-
ignate, the 2004 District of Columbia Special Olympics
Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred
to as the "event") may be run through the Capitol
Grounds as part of the journey of the Special Olympics
torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics sum-
mer games.
SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.
The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
may be necessary to carry out the event.
SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-
TIONS.
The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
for physical preparations for the event.
SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.
The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-

24 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,

- 1 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
- 2 Grounds, in connection with the event.
