JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States regarding presidential election voting rights for residents of all United States territories and commonwealths.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "ARTICLE —
- 4 "Section 1. The right of citizens of the United
- 5 States to vote in the election for President and Vice Presi-
- 6 dent shall not be denied or abridged by the United States
- 7 or by any State on account of residency in a territory or
- 8 commonwealth of the United States.
- 9 "Section 2. The Congress shall have power to en-
- 10 force this article by appropriate legislation.".
