Mr. LUCAS of Oklahoma introduced the following joint resolution; which was
referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United
States to protect the Pledge of Allegiance.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-*
3 *thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
9 for ratification:

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “It is not an establishment of religion for teachers
3 in a public school to recite, or to lead willing students in
4 the recitation of, the following pledge: ‘I pledge allegiance
5 to the flag of the United States of America and to the
6 Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indi-
7 visible, with liberty and justice for all.’”.
