JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States limiting the number of consecutive terms that a Senator or Representative may serve and providing for 4-year terms for Representatives.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the following article is proposed as an amendment
- 4 to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be
- 5 valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitu-
- 6 tion when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of
- 7 the several States within 7 years after the date of its sub-
- 8 mission for ratification:

- 2 "Section 1. No person who has been a Senator for
- 3 4 full consecutive terms shall again be a Senator.
- 4 "Sec. 2. No person who has been a Representative
- 5 for 24 full consecutive years shall again be a Representa-
- 6 tive.
- 7 "Sec. 3. The House of Representatives shall be com-
- 8 posed of Members chosen every 4th year by the people
- 9 of the several States.
- 10 "Sec. 4. For the purposes of this article, any term
- 11 that began before the 1st day that this article is valid as
- 12 part of the Constitution shall not be included in deter-
- 13 mining the number of full consecutive terms that a person
- 14 has been a Senator or Representative.".
