A BILL

To provide that no more than 50 percent of funding made available under the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Act of 1981 for any fiscal year be provided for home heating purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “LIHEAP Equity Act
5 of 2002”.

1 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.**

2 Section 2604(a)(1) of the Low-Income Home Energy
3 Assistance Act of 1981 (42 U.S.C. 8623(a)(1)) is amend-
4 ed—

5 (1) in subparagraph (A) by striking “subpara-
6 graph (B)” and inserting “subparagraphs (B) and
7 (C)”; and

8 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
9 paragraph:

10 “(C) Not more than 50 percent of amounts appro-
11 priated for carrying out this title for any fiscal year shall
12 be provided for home heating purposes.”.
