A BILL

To establish the Commission on Medical Malpractice Insurance.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. COMMISSION ON MEDICAL MALPRACTICE IN-
- 4 SURANCE.
- 5 (a) Establishment.—There is established a com-
- 6 mission to be known as the Commission on Medical Mal-
- 7 practice Insurance (in this section referred to as the
- 8 "Commission").
- 9 (b) Duty.—The duty of the Commission shall be to
- 10 study the cause of rising medical malpractice premium
- 11 rates by medical malpractice insurance carriers in the

- 1 United States during the 20-year period ending with the
- 2 date of the enactment of this Act, which shall include (but
- 3 not be limited to) study of the following matters:
- 4 (1) The investment, accounting, and pricing
- 5 practices of such carriers.
- 6 (2) Jury awards in medical malpractice cases.
- 7 (c) Members.—The Commission shall be composed
- 8 of 8 members, each of whom shall be an expert in matters
- 9 relating to the duty of the Commission and shall serve
- 10 without pay. The members shall be appointed as follows:
- 11 (1) 2 members appointed by the majority leader
- of the Senate.
- 13 (2) 2 members appointed by the minority leader
- of the Senate.
- 15 (3) 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the
- 16 House of Representatives.
- 17 (4) 2 members appointed by the minority leader
- of the House of Representatives.
- 19 (d) Staff.—Subject to the availability of appropria-
- 20 tions, the Commission may appoint and fix the pay of per-
- 21 sonnel as it considers appropriate.
- 22 (e) Obtaining Official Data.—The Commission
- 23 may secure directly from any department or agency of the
- 24 United States information necessary to enable it to carry
- 25 out this Act. Upon request of the Commission, the head

- 1 of that department or agency shall furnish that informa-
- 2 tion to the Commission.
- 3 (f) Mails.—The Commission may use the United
- 4 States mails in the same manner and under the same con-
- 5 ditions as other departments and agencies of the United
- 6 States.
- 7 (g) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date
- 8 of the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall submit
- 9 to Congress a report. The report shall contain a detailed
- 10 statement of the findings and conclusions of the Commis-
- 11 sion, together with its recommendations for legislation or
- 12 administrative action and any other matter that the Com-
- 13 mission considers appropriate.
- 14 (h) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall terminate
- 15 upon submitting its report under subsection (g).
- 16 (i) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS. There is
- 17 authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be nec-
- 18 essary to carry out this Act.
