A BILL

To amend the Solid Waste Disposal Act to provide funding for the clean up of MTBE contamination from underground storage tanks, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL ACT.**

4 Section 9010 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 **SEC. 9010. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

7 “(a) IN GENERAL.—For authorization of appropria-
8 tions to carry out this subtitle, other than with respect
9 to MTBE contamination, see section 2007(f).

1 “(b) MTBE CONTAMINATION.—In order to protect
2 human health, welfare, and the environment from release
3 of methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) from underground
4 storage tanks, there are authorized to be appropriated
5 from the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund
6 established by section 9508 of the Internal Revenue Code
7 of 1986, notwithstanding section 9508(c)(1) of such Code,
8 \$200,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2004, 2005,
9 2006, 2007, and 2008 to be used by the Administrator
10 under this subtitle for assessment, corrective action, in-
11 spection of underground storage tank systems, operator
12 certification and training, and groundwater monitoring in
13 connection with methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) con-
14 tamination.”.

15 **SEC. 2. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.**

16 Section 9001(2)(B) is amended by inserting “(includ-
17 ing MTBE or any other fuel additive)” before the period
18 at the end thereof.
