## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Transportation to make grants to Orange County, California, for intercounty express bus service, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3       SECTION 1. INTERCOUNTY EXPRESS BUS SERVICE.**

4       The Secretary of Transportation shall make grants  
5       under section 5309 of title 49, United States Code, to Or-  
6       ange County, California, for the purchase of 46 buses and  
7       related equipment for intercounty express bus service for  
8       the following routes:

(1) State Route (SR) 57 Corridor- Industry to  
Anaheim Resort.

3 (2) SR-91 Corridor- Corona to Anaheim Indus-  
4 trial.

5 (3) SR-91 Corridor- Riverside to Anaheim Re-  
6 sort.

7 (4) SR-91 Corridor- Riverside to South Coast  
8 Plaza.

9 (5) SR-91 Corridor- Riverside to University of  
10 California, Irvine.

## 11 (6) Long Beach to South Coast Metro.

12 (7) San Clemente to South Coast Metro.

13 (8) Long Beach to Orange.

## 14 SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

15 (a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be available to the  
16 Secretary of Transportation from the Mass Transit Ac-  
17 count of the Highway Trust Fund to carry out this Act  
18 \$2,520,000 for fiscal year 2004, \$2,520,000 for fiscal year  
19 2005, \$3,040,000 for fiscal year 2006, \$3,040,000 for fis-  
20 cal year 2007, \$3,560,000 for fiscal year 2008, and  
21 \$3,560,000 for fiscal year 2009. Such sums shall remain  
22 available until expended.

23 (b) CONTRACT AUTHORITY.—A grant approved by  
24 the Secretary under this Act is a contractual obligation

- 1 of the United States Government to pay the Government's
- 2 share of the cost of the project.
