- 3 SECTION 1. GOLD CONTENT FOR MEDAL OF HONOR.
- 4 (a) Requirement for Gold Content.—Sections
- 5 3741, 6241, and 8741 of title 10, United States Code,
- 6 and section 491 of title 14, United States Code, are each
- 7 amended by inserting "the metal content of which is 90
- 8 percent gold and 10 percent alloy and" after "appropriate
- 9 design,".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 2 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to any award of

3 the Medal of Honor after the date of the enactment of

4 this Act.
