3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Polluter Accountability5 Act".

6 SEC. 2. FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT.

7 (a) CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR NEGLIGENT VIOLA-

8 TIONS.—Section 309(c)(1) of the Federal Water Pollution

9 Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1319(c)(1)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking "\$2,500" and inserting 2 "\$5,000";

3 (2) by striking "\$25,000" and inserting
4 "\$50,000"; and

5 (3) by striking "\$50,000" and inserting
6 "\$100,000".

7 (b) CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR KNOWING VIOLA8 TIONS.—Section 309(c)(2) of the Federal Water Pollution
9 Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1319(c)(2)) is amended—

10 (1) by striking "\$5,000" and inserting 11 "\$15,000";

12 (2) by striking "\$50,000" and inserting
13 "\$250,000"; and

14 (3) by striking "\$100,000" and inserting
15 "\$500,000".

16 SEC. 3. REFUSE ACT OF 1899.

Section 16 of the Act of March 3, 1899 (chapter 425;
33 U.S.C. 411), relating to penalties for violations of the
provision of law popularly known as the Refuse Act of
1899, is amended by striking "\$25,000" and inserting
"\$75,000".
