Mr. FALCOMA introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to extend the eligibility for housing loans guaranteed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs under the Native American Housing Loan Pilot Program to veterans who are married to Native Americans.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF ELIGIBILITY UNDER THE NA-**
2 **TIVE AMERICAN HOUSING LOAN PILOT PRO-**
3 **GRAM TO A VETERAN WHO IS THE SPOUSE OF**
4 **A NATIVE AMERICAN.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Paragraph (2) of section 3764
6 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by inserting
7 “or who is a qualified non-Native American veteran, as
8 defined in paragraph (5)” before the period.

9 (2) Such section is further amended by adding at the
10 end the following new paragraph:

11 “(5) The term ‘qualified non-Native American
12 veteran’ means a veteran who is not a Native Amer-
13 ican and who is the spouse of a Native American.”.

14 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 3762 of
15 such title is amended by adding at the end the following
16 new subsection:

17 “(k) With respect to direct housing loans made to a
18 qualified non-Native American veteran, as defined in sec-
19 tion 3764(5) of this title, any reference in this section to
20 the jurisdiction of a tribal organization over a Native
21 American veteran is deemed to be a reference to the Na-
22 tive American spouse of the qualified non-Native American
23 veteran.”.

1 (c) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section
2 3762(c)(1)(A) of such title is amended by inserting “vet-
3 eran” after “Native American”.
