# A BILL

- To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require institutions of higher education to preserve the educational status and financial resources of military personnel called to active duty.

  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Reservist and National
  - 5 Guard Opportunities and Protection of Education Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR MILITARY SERVICE.
  - 7 (a) Obligation as Part of Program Participa-
  - 8 TION REQUIREMENTS.—Section 487(a)(22) of the Higher

- 1 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1094(a)(22)) is amend-
- 2 ed by inserting "and with the policy on leave of absence
- 3 for active duty military service established pursuant to
- 4 section 484C" after "section 484B".
- 5 (b) Leave of Absence for Military Service.—
- 6 Part G of title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965
- 7 is amended by inserting after section 484B (20 U.S.C.
- 8 1094) the following new section:

#### 9 "SEC. 484C. LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR MILITARY SERVICE.

- 10 "(a) Leave of Absence Required.—Whenever a
- 11 student who is a member of the National Guard or other
- 12 reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United
- 13 States, or a member of such Armed Forces in a retired
- 14 status, is called or ordered to active duty, the institution
- 15 of higher education in which the student is enrolled shall
- 16 grant the student a military leave of absence from the in-
- 17 stitution while such student is serving on active duty, and
- 18 for one year after the conclusion of such service.
- 19 "(b) Consequences of Military Leave of Ab-
- 20 SENCE.—
- 21 "(1) Preservation of status and ac-
- 22 COUNTS.—A student on a military leave of absence
- from an institution of higher education shall be enti-
- tled, upon release from serving on active duty, to be
- 25 restored to the educational status such student had

attained prior to being ordered to such duty without loss of academic credits earned, scholarships or grants awarded by the institution, or, subject to paragraph (2), tuition and other fees paid prior to the commencement of the active duty.

### "(2) Refunds.—

"(A) OBLIGATION TO REFUND; WITH-DRAWAL NOT AUTOMATIC.—An institution of higher education shall refund tuition or fees paid prior to the commencement of the active duty. Notwithstanding the 180-day limitation in section 484B(a)(2)(B), a student on a military leave of absence under this section shall not be treated as having withdrawn for purposes of section 484B unless the student fails to return at the end of the military leave of absence (as determined under subsection (a) of this section).

"(B) PROPORTIONATE REDUCTION OF RE-FUND FOR TIME COMPLETED.—If a student taking a military leave of absence for active duty requests a refund during a period of enrollment, the percentage of the tuition and fees that shall be refunded shall be equal 100 percent minus

cent minus—

1	"(i) the percentage of the period of
2	enrollment (for which the tuition and fees
3	were paid) that was completed (as deter-
4	mined in accordance with section 484B(d))
5	as of the day the student withdrew, pro-
6	vided that such date occurs on or before
7	the completion of 60 percent of the period
8	of enrollment; or
9	"(ii) 100 percent, if the day the stu-
10	dent withdrew occurs after the student has
11	completed 60 percent of the period of en-
12	rollment.
13	"(c) Active Duty.—In this section, the term 'active
14	duty' has the meaning given such term in section
15	101(d)(1) of title 10, United States Code, except that such
16	term—
17	"(1) does not include active duty for training or
18	attendance at a service school; but
19	"(2) includes, in the case of members of the
20	National Guard, active State duty.".
