3 **SECTION 1. REMOVAL OF EXEMPTION FROM PROHIBITION**
4 **ON MILITARY ASSISTANCE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1 of the Act entitled “An
6 Act to authorize the President to exercise waivers of for-
7 eign assistance restrictions with respect to Pakistan
8 through September 30, 2003, and for other purposes”, ap-

1 proved October 27, 2001 (Public Law 107–57), is re-
2 pealed.

3 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The repeal made by subsection
4 (a) shall apply to all funds expended on or after the date
5 of the enactment of this Act, and to any funds obligated
6 before the date of the enactment of this Act that have
7 not been expended as of such date of enactment.
