A BILL

To amend the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 to require public availability of an accounting of all funds used, or required to be used, for response to a release of a hazardous substance or pollutant or contaminant.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pollution Account-
5 ability Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENT.**

2 Section 117 of the Comprehensive Environmental Re-
3 sponse, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42
4 U.S.C. 9617) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
5 lowing new subsection:

6 “(f) ACCOUNTING.—Any person who undertakes, or
7 who is required to undertake, a response to a release of
8 a hazardous substance or pollutant or contaminant shall
9 make available to any person, on request, an accounting
10 of any funds used, or required by any court or administra-
11 tive action to be used, for such response.”.
