AN ACT

To award a congressional gold medal to Prime Minister
Tony Blair.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. FINDING.**

2 The Congress finds that Prime Minister Tony Blair
3 of the United Kingdom has clearly demonstrated, during
4 a very trying and historic time for our 2 countries, that
5 he is a staunch and steadfast ally of the United States
6 of America.

7 **SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.**

8 (a) PRESENTATION AUTHORIZED.—The Speaker of
9 the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tem-
10 pore of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements
11 for the presentation, on behalf of the Congress, of a gold
12 medal of appropriate design, to Prime Minister Tony
13 Blair, in recognition of his outstanding and enduring con-
14 tributions to maintaining the security of all freedom-loving
15 nations.

16 (b) DESIGN AND STRIKING.—For purposes of the
17 presentation referred to in subsection (a), the Secretary
18 of the Treasury (referred to in this Act as the ‘Secretary’)
19 shall strike a gold medal with suitable emblems, devices,
20 and inscriptions to be determined by the Secretary.

21 **SEC. 3. DUPLICATE MEDALS.**

22 The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in
23 bronze of the gold medal struck pursuant to section 2
24 under such regulations as the Secretary may prescribe, at
25 a price sufficient to cover the cost thereof, including labor,

1 materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses,
2 and the cost of the gold medal.

3 **SEC. 4. STATUS OF MEDALS.**

4 (a) NATIONAL MEDALS.—The medals struck pursuant
5 to this Act are national medals for purposes of chapter
6 51 of title 31, United States Code.

7 (b) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of section
8 5134 of title 31, United States Code, all medals struck
9 under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.

10 **SEC. 5. AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS; PROCEEDS OF
11 SALE.**

12 (a) AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS.—There is
13 authorized to be charged against the United States Mint
14 Public Enterprise Fund such amounts as may be necessary
15 to pay for the costs of the medals struck pursuant
16 to this Act.

17 (b) PROCEEDS OF SALE.—Amounts received from the
18 sale of duplicate bronze medals authorized under section
19 3 shall be deposited into the United States Mint Public
20 Enterprise Fund.
