## A BILL

To clarify that the Upper Missouri River Breaks National Monument does not include within its boundaries any privately owned property, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PRIVATELY OWNED PROPERTY EXCLUDED**  
2 **FROM MONUMENT.**

3 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the  
4 “Upper Missouri River Breaks Boundary Clarification  
5 Act”.

6 (b) PRIVATELY OWNED PROPERTY EXCLUDED FROM  
7 MONUMENT.—

8 (1) PROPERTY CLARIFICATION.—The Upper  
9 Missouri River Breaks National Monument, estab-  
10 lished by Presidential proclamation 7398 on January  
11 17, 2001, shall not include within its boundaries any  
12 privately owned property.

13 (2) MAP.—The Secretary shall keep a map of  
14 the Monument reflecting the boundary clarification  
15 in paragraph (1) on file and available for public in-  
16 spection in the appropriate offices of the Director of  
17 the Bureau of Land Management, Department of  
18 the Interior.
