  - 3 SECTION 1. ADDITIONAL WEEKS OF BENEFITS.
  - 4 Section 203 of the Temporary Extended Unemploy-
  - 5 ment Compensation Act of 2002 is amended by adding
  - 6 at the end the following:
  - 7 "(d) Additional Weeks of Benefits.—Notwith-
  - 8 standing any other provision of this section, upon the ex-

- 1 haustion of all amounts that may be credited to an individ-
- 2 ual's account under the preceding provisions of this sec-
- 3 tion, such account shall be increased by an amount equal
- 4 to the amount originally established in such account under
- 5 subsection (b)(1).".

#### 6 SEC. 2. PROGRAM EXTENSION.

- 7 Paragraph (2) of section 208 of the Temporary Ex-
- 8 tended Unemployment Compensation Act of 2002 is
- 9 amended by striking "2003" and inserting "2004".

### 10 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
- 12 as if included in the enactment of the Temporary Ex-
- 13 tended Unemployment Compensation Act of 2002.
