Mr. TANNER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Army to convey certain land at Fort Campbell, Kentucky and Tennessee, for the purpose of realigning and upgrading United States Highway 79 from a 2-lane highway to a 4-lane highway.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TRANSFER OF LAND AT FORT CAMPBELL, KEN-**
4 **TUCKY AND TENNESSEE.**

5 (a) CONVEYANCE AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of
6 the Army may convey to the department of transportation
7 of the State of Tennessee, all right, title, and interest of
8 the United States in and to a parcel of real property

1 (right-of-way), including improvements thereon located at
2 Fort Campbell, Kentucky and Tennessee, for the purpose
3 of realigning and upgrading United States Highway 79
4 from a 2-lane highway to a 4-lane highway.

5 (b) CONSIDERATION.—

6 (1) PAYMENT.—The department of transpor-
7 tation of the State of Tennessee shall pay from any
8 source (including Federal funds made available to
9 the State from the Highway Trust Fund) all of the
10 Secretary's costs associated with the conveyance of
11 the right-of-way, preparation of documents under
12 the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42
13 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.), surveys (including surveys
14 under subsection (d)), cultural reviews, administra-
15 tive expenses, cemetery relocation, and other ex-
16 penses necessary to transfer the property (right-of-
17 way), acquisition of approximately 200 acres of mis-
18 sion essential replacement land required to support
19 the Secretary's training mission at Fort Campbell,
20 and the disposal of residual land located south of the
21 realigned highway.

22 (2) ACCEPTANCE AND CREDIT.—The Secretary
23 may accept funds under this subsection from the
24 Federal Highway Administration or the State of
25 Tennessee to pay costs described in paragraph (1)

1 and credit them to the appropriate Department of
2 the Army accounts for the purpose of paying such
3 costs

4 (3) PERIOD OF AVAILABILITY.—All funds ac-
5 cepted by the Secretary under this subsection shall
6 remain available until expended.

7 (c) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY.—The acreage
8 of the property (right-of-way) to be conveyed, acquired,
9 and disposed of under this section shall be determined by
10 surveys satisfactory to the Secretary.

11 (d) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
12 Secretary may require such additional terms and condi-
13 tions in connection with the conveyance under this section
14 as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the inter-
15 ests of the United States.
