A BILL

To reinstate and transfer a hydroelectric license under the Federal Power Act to permit the redevelopment of a hydroelectric project located in the State of New York, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**
- 4 The Congress finds that actions by the Federal En-
- 5 ergy Regulatory Commission (FERC) leading to the ac-
- 6 ceptance and approval of the surrender of a hydroelectric
- 7 license for Project No. 6032, including, but not limited
- 8 to, the FERC's failure to ensure, during the effective pe-

- 1 riod of the issued hydroelectric license, that the project's
- 2 facilities were adequately maintained and operated, pre-
- 3 vented the project from generating electricity and thereby
- 4 wasted the hydraulic potential of waters of the United
- 5 States.

6 SEC. 2. REINSTATEMENT AND TRANSFER.

- 7 (a) Reinstatement and Transfer of Federal
- 8 License for Project Numbered 6032.—Notwith-
- 9 standing section 8 of the Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C.
- 10 801) or any other provision thereof the FERC is directed
- 11 to reinstate the license for Project No. 6032 and to trans-
- 12 fer the license, without delay or the institution of any pro-
- 13 ceedings, to any prior licensee for Project No. 6032 who
- 14 has not been ordered by the New York Public Service
- 15 Commission to divest its generation facilities, with a li-
- 16 cense term of fifty years running from the date of trans-
- 17 fer, within 30 days of enactment of this Act. All deadlines
- 18 established under the license, including without limitation
- 19 the deadlines for acquisition of project property and for
- 20 commencement of construction, shall run from the date
- 21 of transfer.
- 22 (b) Hydroelectric Incentives.—Project No.
- 23 6032 shall be entitled to the full benefit of any legislation
- 24 passed by Congress that promotes hydroelectric develop-

- 1 ment within 2 years either before or after this Act's effec-
- 2 tive date.
