3 **SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS TO MILITARY SERVICE ACAD-**
4 **EMIES FROM NOMINATIONS MADE BY DELE-**
5 **GATES FROM GUAM AND VIRGIN ISLANDS.**

6 (a) UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY.—Section
7 4342(a) of title 10, United States Code, is amended in

1 paragraphs (6) and (8) by striking “Two” and inserting
2 “Three”.

3 (b) UNITED STATES NAVAL ACADEMY.—Section
4 6954(a) of such title is amended in paragraphs (6) and
5 (8) by striking “Two” and inserting “Three”.

6 (c) UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY.—Section
7 9342(a) of such title is amended in paragraphs (6) and
8 (8) by striking “Two” and inserting “Three”.

9 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
10 this section shall apply with respect to the nomination of
11 candidates for appointment to the United States Military
12 Academy, the United States Naval Academy, and the
13 United States Air Force Academy for classes entering
14 these military service academies after the date of the en-
15 actment of this Act.
