A BILL

To require amounts appropriated under any Act making emergency supplemental appropriations for the reconstruction of Iraq and Afghanistan and the war on terrorism for fiscal year 2004 to be made available in allotments and in accordance with certain reporting requirements.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “War Funding Account-
3 ability Act of 2003”.

4 **SEC. 2. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS IN EMERGENCY SUPPLE-**
5 **MENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ACTS FOR THE**
6 **RECONSTRUCTION OF IRAQ AND AFGHANI-**
7 **STAN AND THE WAR ON TERRORISM.**

8 (a) AVAILABILITY.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
9 vision of law, amounts appropriated by an Act, enacted
10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, making emer-
11 gency supplemental appropriations for the reconstruction
12 of Iraq and Afghanistan and the war on terrorism for fis-
13 cal year 2004 may only be made available in allotments
14 of \$20,000,000,000 or less and only if, not less than 15
15 days prior to obligation and expenditure of amounts in
16 each such allotment, the President transmits to Congress
17 a report described in subsection (b).

18 (b) REPORT.—A report referred to in subsection (a)
19 is a report that contains the following:

20 (1) For each program, project, or activity to be
21 funded in the allotment at an amount equal to or
22 greater than \$1,000,000, a detailed description of
23 the purpose of the program, project, or activity.

24 (2) For each program, project, or activity to be
25 funded in the allotment for the rehabilitation or re-
26 construction of Iraq or Afghanistan—

1 (A) a detailed description of the purpose of
2 the program, project, or activity; and

3 (B) in the case of contract entered into by
4 the United States Government for the repair,
5 maintenance, or construction of infrastructure
6 in Iraq or Afghanistan—

7 (i) the name of the contractor and the
8 process by which the contract was award-
9 ed;

10 (ii) the amount of the contract; and

11 (iii) the date on which work under the
12 contract is to begin.

13 (3) A description of the progress being made to
14 achieve the goal of restoring self-government to Iraq,
15 providing civil services to the Iraqi people, and en-
16 suring adequate security for the Iraqi people.

17 (4) A comprehensive survey of the security, in-
18 frastructure, and other needs in Iraq and Afghani-
19 stan, including progress made in the reconstruction
20 of the electric power infrastructure, water and sew-
21 age services, the telecommunications infrastructure,
22 and the repair and upgrade of hospitals, clinics, pub-
23 lic buildings, roadways, and bridges.

24 (5) An assessment of any other security and re-
25 construction needs in Iraq and Afghanistan, includ-

1 ing estimates of additional funding that will be re-
2 quired to meet those needs.

3 (6) A description of efforts to obtain increased
4 assistance from other countries for the rehabilitation
5 and reconstruction of Iraq, including increased fi-
6 nancial assistance and security assistance (such as
7 deployment of military forces or other related per-
8 sonnel).

9 (7) A description of efforts to provide adequate
10 deployment rotation and other relief for United
11 States troops serving in Iraq, including efforts to
12 construct improved living quarters for those United
13 States troops.
