## A BILL

To amend title 40, United States Code, to direct the Administrator of General Services to give preference to high unemployment areas in selecting sites for the construction of public buildings and in leasing space to accommodate Federal agencies.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “High Unemployment  
5       Area Assistance Act of 2003”.

6       **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7       Congress finds that—

1 (1) according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics  
2 of the Department of Labor, 3,127,000 net private  
3 sector jobs have been lost since January 2001;

4 (2) the national unemployment rate was 6.2  
5 percent in July 2003;

6 (3) certain industries and geographical areas  
7 have borne a disproportionate share of the job loss  
8 and unemployment;

9 (4) according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics,  
10 2,406,000 net manufacturing sector jobs have been  
11 lost since January 2001; and

12 (5) unemployment in many manufacturing in-  
13 tensive areas exceeded 10 percent in July 2003.

14 **SEC. 3. PREFERENCE FOR LOCATING PUBLIC BUILDINGS**  
15 **IN HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT AREAS.**

16 Section 3306 of title 40, United States Code, is  
17 amended by adding at the end the following:

18 “(d) PREFERENCE FOR HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT  
19 AREAS.—In selecting sites for the construction of public  
20 buildings and in leasing space to accommodate Federal  
21 agencies, the Administrator shall give preference to areas  
22 in which, for the most recent 12-month period for which  
23 data is available, the unemployment rate exceeds the na-  
24 tional average by 2 percentage points or more, as cal-

1 culated by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the Depart-  
2 ment of Labor.”.
