3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.					
4	This Act may be cited as the "Manhattan Project Sites					
5	Study Act of 2004".					
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.					
7	In this Act:					
8	(1) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means					
9	the Secretary of the Interior.					
10	(2) STUDY.—The term "study" means the study					
11	authorized by section $3(a)$.					
12	(3) STUDY AREA.—The term "study area" mean					
13	the following historically significant sites associated					
14	with the Manhattan Project sites:					
15	(A) Los Alamos National Laboratory and					
16	townsite in the State of New Mexico.					
17	(B) The Hanford Site in the State of Wash-

19	(C) Oak Ridge Laboratory in the State of

21	SEC. 3. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.					
22	(a) Study.—					
23	(1) In General.—The Secretary in consultation					
24	with the Secretary of Energy, shall conduct a special					
25	resource study of the study area to assess the national

2	one or more sites within the study area as a unit of
3	the National Park System in accordance with section
4	8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5(c)).
5	(2) Administration.—In conducting the study,
6	the Secretary shall—
7	(A) consult with interested Federal, State,
8	tribal, and local officials, representatives of orga-
9	nizations, and members of the public;
10	(B) evaluate, in coordination with the Sec-
11	retary of Energy, the compatibility of desig-
12	nating one or more sites within the study area
13	as a unit of the National Park System with
14	maintaining the security, productivity, and
15	management goals of the Department of Energy
16	and public health and safety; and
17	(C) consider research in existence on the
18	date of enactment of this Act by the Department
19	of Energy on the historical significance and fea-
20	sibility of preserving and interpreting the var-
21	ious sites and structures in the study area.
22	(b) Report.—Not later than 2 years after the date
23	on which funds are made available to carry out the study,
24	the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report that de-
