- 3 SECTION 1. PLACEMENT OF STATUES OF CITIZENS OF DIS-
- 4 TRICT OF COLUMBIA IN STATUARY HALL.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1814 of the Revised Stat-
- 6 utes (2 U.S.C. 2061) is amended by adding at the end
- 7 the following new sentence: "For purposes of this section,
- 8 the term 'State' shall include the District of Columbia.".

1	(b) Conforming Amendment Regarding Proce-
2	DURES FOR REPLACEMENT OF STATUES.—Section 311 of
3	the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 2001 (2
4	U.S.C. 2062), is amended by adding at the end the fol-
5	lowing new subsection:
6	"(f) For purposes of this section—
7	"(1) the term 'State' shall include the District
8	of Columbia; and
9	"(2) in the case of the District of Columbia, the
10	Council of the District of Columbia shall be treated
11	as the legislature and the Mayor of the District of
12	Columbia shall be treated as the Governor.".
