- 3 SECTION 1. MIGRATORY BIRD MANAGEMENT BY THE DE-
- 4 **PARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.**
- 5 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the
 6 "American Aquaculture and Fishery Resources Protection
 7 Act".

(b) EXEMPTION FROM NEPA.—Migratory bird man agement activities carried out by the Secretary of Agri culture shall be exempt from the National Environmental
 Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.).

5 (c) ACTIONS UNDER THE MIGRATORY BIRD TREATY
6 ACT.—An agent, officer, or employee of the Animal and
7 Plant Health Inspection Service of the Department of Ag8 riculture that carries out any activity relating to migratory
9 bird management may take the following actions under the
10 Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16 U.S.C. 703 et seq.):

(1) Issue depredation permits to stakeholders orcooperators of the Service.
