A BILL

To amend the reclamation laws to clarify that certain manmade facilities that receive water from a Bureau of Reclamation Project are not navigable waters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. MAN-MADE FACILITIES THAT RECEIVE WATER

FROM A BUREAU OF RECLAMATION PROJECT

ARE NOT NAVIGABLE WATERS.

The first section of the Act of July 4, 1955 (chapter 271; 43 U.S.C. 421a), is amended—

(1) by striking "That distribution and drainage

systems" and inserting the following:

- 2 (2) by adding at the end the following:
- 3 "(b) Except for reservoirs in navigable streams or riv-
- 4 ers, man-made facilities that receive water from a Bureau
- 5 of Reclamation Project and store or convey water for irri-
- 6 gation or drainage purposes, shall not be considered to be
- 7 navigable waters of the United States.".
