## AN ACT

To authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to convey certain lands and improvements associated with the National Forest System in the State of Pennsylvania, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the  
3 “Pennsylvania National Forest Improvement Act of  
4 2004”.

5 (b) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents for  
6 this Act is as follows:

7 **SEC. 2. DISPOSAL OF ADMINISTRATIVE SITES, ALLEGHENY**  
8 **NATIONAL FOREST, PENNSYLVANIA.**

9 (a) DISPOSAL AUTHORITY.—The Secretary of Agri-  
10 culture may convey, by sale or exchange, any and all right,  
11 title, and interest of the United States in and to the fol-  
12 lowing National Forest System lands and administrative  
13 sites in the Allegheny National Forest, in Pennsylvania:

14 (1) US Tract 121, Sheffield ranger residence,  
15 consisting of 0.41 acres, as depicted on the map ti-  
16 tled “Allegheny Unit, Allen M. Gibson Tract 121,  
17 March 1942”.

18 (2) US Tract 896, an undeveloped administra-  
19 tive site, consisting of 2.42 acres, as depicted on the

1 map titled “Allegheny Unit, Howard L. Harp Tract  
2 896, 1947”.

3 (3) US Tract 1047 (formerly Tracts 551,  
4 551a,b,c), original Marienville Ranger District  
5 Headquarters, consisting of 4.90 acres, as depicted  
6 on the map titled “Marienville Ranger Station Com-  
7 pound Tract 1047, August 1998”.

8 (4) US Tract 844, Marienville ranger residence,  
9 as depicted on the map titled “Allegheny Unit, Peter  
10 B. DeSmet Tract 844, 1936”, except that portion of  
11 the tract identified as Lot 2, on the Survey Plat pre-  
12 pared by D. M. Heller and dated December 12,  
13 1999, which is subject to conveyance under section  
14 5.

15 (b) PROPERTY DESCRIPTIONS.—The maps referred  
16 to in subsection (a) are the primary descriptions of the  
17 lands to which the maps refer. In the event of a conflict  
18 between a map description and the metes and bounds de-  
19 scription of the lands, the map shall be deemed to be the  
20 definitive description of the lands unless the map cannot  
21 be located. The maps shall be on file and available for  
22 public inspection in the Office of the Chief of the Forest  
23 Service until the lands are disposed of pursuant to this  
24 section.

25 (c) CONSIDERATION.—

1           (1) AUTHORIZED CONSIDERATION.—As consid-  
2           eration for a conveyance of land under subsection  
3           (a), the recipient of the land, with the consent of the  
4           Secretary, may convey to the Secretary other land,  
5           existing improvements, or improvements constructed  
6           to the specifications of the Secretary.

7           (2) CASH EQUALIZATION.—Notwithstanding  
8           any other provision of law, the Secretary may accept  
9           a cash equalization payment in excess of 25 percent  
10          of the value of any land and administrative site ex-  
11          changed under subsection (a).

12          (d) APPLICABLE LAW.—Except as otherwise provided  
13          in this section, any conveyance of land under subsection  
14          (a) shall be subject to the laws and regulations applicable  
15          to the conveyance and acquisition of land for the National  
16          Forest System.

17          (e) SOLICITATION OF OFFERS.—

18                (1) CONVEYANCE PRIORITY.—In the selection  
19                of the recipient of land under this section, the Sec-  
20                retary may give a preference to public entities that  
21                agree to use the land for public purposes.

22                (2) TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The Secretary  
23                may solicit offers for the conveyance of land under  
24                this section on such terms and conditions as the Sec-  
25                retary may prescribe.



1 (b) CONSIDERATION.—As consideration for the con-  
2 veyance under subsection (a), the Warren County Develop-  
3 ment Association shall make to the Secretary a lump sum  
4 payment of \$100,000.

5 (c) PROPERTY DESCRIPTION.—The map referred to  
6 in subsection (a) is the primary description of the lands  
7 to which the map refers. In the event of a conflict between  
8 the map description and the metes and bounds description  
9 of the lands, the map shall be deemed to be the definitive  
10 description of the lands unless the map cannot be located.  
11 The map shall be on file and available for public inspection  
12 in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service until the  
13 lands are disposed of pursuant to this section.

14 (d) REVOCATIONS.—Notwithstanding any other pro-  
15 vision of law, on conveyance of land by the Secretary  
16 under this section, any public order withdrawing the land  
17 from any form of appropriation under the public land laws  
18 is revoked.

19 **SEC. 4. CONVEYANCE OF RIDGEWAY RANGER DISTRICT**  
20 **HEADQUARTERS, ELK COUNTY, PENNSYL-**  
21 **VANIA.**

22 (a) CONVEYANCE AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of  
23 Agriculture may convey to Ridgeway Township, Pennsyl-  
24 vania, all right, title, and interest of the United States  
25 in and to US Tract 904, consisting of 8.812 acres, and

1 US Tract 905, consisting of 0.869 acres, Ridgeway Rang-  
2 er District Headquarters, as depicted on the maps titled  
3 “Allegheny Unit, Harry R. Eliza E. Larson Tract 904,  
4 1959” and “Allegheny Unit, Leo S. Laura A. Guth Tract  
5 905, July 1948”.

6 (b) CONSIDERATION.—As consideration for the con-  
7 veyance under subsection (a), Ridgeway Township shall  
8 pay to the Secretary an amount equal to the fair market  
9 value of the conveyed lands, as determined by an appraisal  
10 acceptable to the Secretary and Ridgeway Township.

11 (c) PROPERTY DESCRIPTION.—The maps referred to  
12 in subsection (a) is the primary description of the lands  
13 to which the maps refer. In the event of a conflict between  
14 a map description and the metes and bounds description  
15 of the lands, the map shall be deemed to be the definitive  
16 description of the lands unless the map cannot be located.  
17 The maps shall be on file and available for public inspec-  
18 tion in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service until  
19 the lands are disposed of pursuant to this section.

20 (d) REVOCATIONS.—Notwithstanding any other pro-  
21 vision of law, on conveyance of land by the Secretary  
22 under this section, any public order withdrawing the land  
23 from any form of appropriation under the public land laws  
24 is revoked.

1 **SEC. 5. CONVEYANCE OF MARIENVILLE RANGER RESI-**  
2 **DENCE, FOREST COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.**

3 (a) CONVEYANCE AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary of  
4 Agriculture may convey, without consideration, to the  
5 Marienville Volunteer Fire Department of Forest County,  
6 Pennsylvania, all right, title, and interest of the United  
7 States in and to that portion of US Tract 844, Marienville  
8 ranger residence, as depicted on the map titled “Allegheny  
9 Unit, Peter B. DeSmet Tract 844, 1936”, which is identi-  
10 fied as Lot 2 on the Survey Plat prepared by D. M. Heller  
11 and dated December 12, 1999.

12 (b) PROPERTY DESCRIPTION.—The map referred to  
13 in subsection (a) is the primary description of the lands  
14 to which the map refers. In the event of a conflict between  
15 the map description and the metes and bounds description  
16 of the lands, the map shall be deemed to be the definitive  
17 description of the lands unless the map cannot be located.  
18 The map shall be on file and available for public inspection  
19 in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service until the  
20 lands are disposed of pursuant to this section.

21 (c) REVOCATIONS.—Notwithstanding any other pro-  
22 vision of law, on conveyance of land by the Secretary  
23 under this section, any public order withdrawing the land  
24 from any form of appropriation under the public land laws  
25 is revoked.

1 **SEC. 6. DISPOSITION OF FUNDS.**

2 (a) DEPOSIT IN SISK ACT FUND.—The Secretary of  
3 Agriculture shall deposit in the fund established under  
4 Public Law 90–171 (16 U.S.C. 484a; commonly known  
5 as the Sisk Act)—

6 (1) the proceeds of a sale or exchange under  
7 section 2; and

8 (2) the consideration received pursuant to sec-  
9 tions 3(b) and 4(b).

10 (b) USE OF PROCEEDS.—Subject to subsection (c),  
11 funds deposited under subsection (a) shall be available to  
12 the Secretary, without further appropriation, for—

13 (1) the acquisition, construction, or improve-  
14 ment of administrative facilities and sites for the Al-  
15 legheny National Forest; or

16 (2) the acquisition of land and interests in land  
17 in the Allegheny National Forest.

18 (c) CONDITION ON LAND ACQUISITION.—The acqui-  
19 sition of lands in the Allegheny National Forest using  
20 funds deposited under subsection (a) is subject to the con-  
21 dition that the market value of the acquired lands may  
22 not exceed 125 percent of the market value of the lands  
23 disposed of under this Act.

1 **SEC. 7. ADMINISTRATION OF LAND ACQUIRED BY UNITED**  
2 **STATES.**

3 Lands acquired by the Secretary of Agriculture under  
4 section 6(b) or by exchange under section 2 shall be man-  
5 aged by the Secretary in accordance with the Act of March  
6 1, 1911 (commonly known as the Weeks Act; 16 U.S.C.  
7 480 et seq.) and other laws and regulations pertaining to  
8 National Forest System lands. For the purposes of section  
9 7 of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965  
10 (16 U.S.C. 460l-9), the boundaries of the Allegheny Na-  
11 tional Forest, as adjusted on account of the disposal and  
12 acquisition of lands under this Act, shall be considered to  
13 be the boundaries of that national forest as of January  
14 1, 1965.

15 **SEC. 8. RELATION TO OTHER CONVEYANCES AUTHORITIES.**

16 Except as expressly provided in this Act, nothing in  
17 this Act affects any other authority of the Secretary of  
18 Agriculture to sell, exchange, or acquire land. Lands au-  
19 thorized for disposal under this Act shall not be subject  
20 to subchapters II and III of chapter 5 of title 40, United  
21 States Code.
