3 "(5) Prior to effective date.—No person 4 (including the United States or any State) may re-5 cover, under the authority of subsection (a)(3) or (4) 6 of section 107, from a service station dealer for any 7 response costs or damages resulting from a release 8 or threatened release of recycled oil, or use the au-9 thority of section 106 against a service station deal-10 er other than a person described in subsection (a)(1) or (2) of section 107, with respect to any period between November 8, 1986, and the effective date de-12 13 scribed in paragraph (4), if the service station dealer 14 had complied with all applicable laws and regula-15 tions relating to the disposal of such oil.".
