A BILL

To amend the Temporary Extended Unemployment Compensation Act and the Federal-State Extended Unemployment Compensation Act to temporarily allow States to disregard the look-back requirement of these Acts for purposes of determining unemployment insurance eligibility.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “TEUC and EB
5 Amendments Act of 2003”.

1 **SEC. 2. ALTERNATIVE TRIGGERS RELATING TO TEUC SEC-**
2 **OND TIER BENEFITS AND EXTENDED UNEM-**
3 **PLOYMENT BENEFITS.**

4 (a) PROVISIONS RELATING TO TEUC.—Section
5 203(e)(2)(B) of the Temporary Extended Unemployment
6 Compensation Act of 2002 (Public Law 107–147; 26
7 U.S.C. 3304 note) is amended to read as follows:

8 “(B) such a period would then be in effect
9 for such State under such Act if—

10 “(i) section 203(d) of such Act were
11 applied as if it had been amended by strik-
12 ing ‘5’ each place it appears and inserting
13 ‘4’; and

14 “(ii) with respect to weeks of unem-
15 ployment beginning on or after the date of
16 enactment of this clause—

17 “(I) paragraph (1)(A) of such
18 section 203(d) did not apply; and

19 “(II) clause (ii) of section
20 203(f)(1)(A) of such Act did not
21 apply.”.

22 (b) PROVISIONS RELATING TO EXTENDED BENE-
23 FITS.—For purposes of conforming with the provisions of
24 the Federal-State Extended Unemployment Compensation
25 Act of 1970 (26 U.S.C. 3304 note), a State may, for
26 weeks of unemployment beginning on after the date of the

1 enactment of this Act and on or before December 31,
2 2004, waive the application of subparagraph (A) of section
3 203(d)(1) of such Act, clause (ii) of section 203(f)(1)(A)
4 of such Act, or both.
