- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Financial Customer
- 5 Identification Verification Improvement Act".

4	Section 5318(l) of title 31, United States Code, is
5	amended—
6	(1) by redesignating paragraph (6) as para-
7	graph (7); and
8	(2) by inserting after paragraph (5) the fol-
9	lowing new paragraph:
10	"(6) Prohibition on use of identification
11	ISSUED BY A FOREIGN GOVERNMENT.—A financial
12	institution may not accept any form of identification
13	that was issued by a foreign government, other than
14	a passport, for use in verifying the identity of a per-
15	son in connection with the opening of an account by
16	such person at the financial institution, including a
17	matricula consular issued in the United States by a
18	duly authorized consular officer of the Government
19	of Mexico.".
