- 6 (a) Exception to Termination of Benefits
- 7 Upon Remarkage.—Section 103(d)(2)(B) of title 38,

- 1 United States Code, is amended by inserting "1311 or"
- 2 after "under section".
- 3 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 4 subsection (a) shall take effect on—
- 5 (1) the first day of the first month that begins
- 6 after the date of the enactment of this Act; or
- 7 (2) the first day of the fiscal year that begins
- 8 in the calendar year in which this Act is enacted, if
- 9 later than the date specified in paragraph (1).
- 10 (c) Retroactive Benefits Prohibited.—No ben-
- 11 efit may be paid to any person by reason of the amend-
- 12 ment made by subsection (a) for any period before the
- 13 effective date specified in subsection (b).
