A BILL

To establish a National Commission on Digestive Diseases.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL COMMISSION ON DIGESTIVE DIS-
- 4 EASES.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
- 6 Human Services (in this section referred to as the "Sec-
- 7 retary"), after consultation with the Director of the Na-
- 8 tional Institutes of Health, shall, within sixty days after
- 9 the date of the enactment of this Act, establish a National
- 10 Commission on Digestive Diseases (in this section referred
- 11 to as the "Commission").
- 12 (b) Duties.—

1	(1) In General.—The Commission shall—
2	(A) conduct a comprehensive study of the
3	present state of knowledge of the incidence, du-
4	ration, and morbidity of, and mortality rates re-
5	sulting from, digestive diseases and of the social
6	and economic impact of such diseases;
7	(B) evaluate the public and private facili-
8	ties and resources (including trained personne
9	and research activities) for the diagnosis, pre-
10	vention, and treatment of, and research in, such
11	diseases; and
12	(C) identify programs (including biological
13	behavioral, nutritional, environmental, and so-
14	cial programs) in which, and the means by
15	which, improvement in the management of di-
16	gestive diseases can be accomplished.
17	(2) Long-range plan.—Based on the study
18	evaluation, and identification made pursuant to
19	paragraph (1), the Commission shall develop and
20	recommend a long-range plan for the use and orga-
21	nization of national resources to effectively deal with
22	digestive diseases. The plan shall provide for—
23	(A) research studies into the basic biologi-
24	cal processes and mechanisms related to diges-
25	tive diseases;

1	(B) investigations into the epidemiology,
2	etiology, diagnosis, treatment, prevention, and
3	control of digestive diseases;
4	(C) development of preventive measures
5	(including education programs, programs for
6	the elimination of environmental hazards re-
7	lated to digestive diseases, and clinical pro-
8	grams) to be taken against digestive diseases;
9	(D) detection of digestive diseases in the
10	presymptomatic stages and development and
11	evaluation of new, and improved methods of
12	screening for digestive diseases, taking into ac-
13	count recent technological changes in diagnostic
14	imaging modalities;
15	(E) development of criteria for the diag-
16	nosis and the clinical management and control
17	of digestive diseases;
18	(F) development of approaches to advance
19	digestive diseases research by incorporating in-
20	sights obtained from genomic and proteomic re-
21	search;
22	(G) development of coordinated health care
23	systems for dealing with digestive diseases;
24	(H) education and training (including con-
25	tinuing education programs) of scientists, clini-

- cians, educators, and allied health professionals in the fields and specialties requisite to the conduct of programs related to digestive diseases with special emphasis on training for careers in research, teaching, and all aspects of patient care;
 - (I) the conduct and subject matter of trials in clinical and translational research in digestive diseases; and
 - (J) establishment of a system of periodic surveillance of the research potential and research needs in digestive diseases.

The long-range plan formulated under this paragraph shall also include within its scope related nutritional disorders and basic biological processes and mechanisms in nutrition which are related to digestive diseases.

(3) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR INDIVIDUAL NATIONAL RESEARCH INSTITUTES.—The Commission shall recommend for each of the Institutes of the National Institutes of Health whose activities are to be affected by the long-range plan estimates of the expenditures needed to carry out each Institute's part of the overall program. Such estimates shall be prepared for the fiscal year beginning immediately

1	after completion of the Commission's plan and for
2	each of the next five fiscal years.
3	(c) Composition.—
4	(1) In General.—The Commission shall be
5	composed of 16 members appointed in accordance
6	with paragraph (2) and the ex officio members des-
7	ignated under paragraph (3). The appointed mem-
8	bers shall be voting members, and the ex officio
9	members shall be nonvoting members, except that
10	the ex officio member designated under paragraph
11	(3)(A) shall be a voting member.
12	(2) Appointed members.—The voting mem-
13	bers of the Commission shall be appointed by the
14	Secretary, and shall be appointed from among indi-
15	viduals who are not officers or employees of the Fed-
16	eral Government. Of such members—
17	(A) 10 shall be appointed from among sci-
18	entists, physicians, and other health profes-
19	sionals, of whom—
20	(i) two shall be practicing clinical gas-
21	troenterologists;
22	(ii) two shall be gastroenterologists in-
23	volved primarily in research on digestive
24	diseases;
25	(iii) one shall be a surgeon;

1	(iv) one shall be an expert in liver dis-
2	ease;
3	(v) one shall be an epidemiologist;
4	(vi) one shall be an allied health pro-
5	fessional; and
6	(vii) two shall be basic biomedical sci-
7	entists (such as biochemists, physiologists,
8	microbiologists, nutritionists, pharma-
9	cologists, or immunologists); and
10	(B) six shall be appointed from among the
11	general public, of whom at least three shall
12	have personal or close family experience with di-
13	gestive diseases.
14	(3) Ex officio members.—
15	(A) NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DIABETES
16	AND DIGESTIVE AND KIDNEY DISEASES.—From
17	among officers or employees of the National In-
18	stitute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney
19	Diseases whose primary interest is in the field
20	of digestive diseases, the Secretary shall des-
21	ignate an individual to serve as an ex officio
22	member of the Commission.
23	(B) Additional members.—The fol-
24	lowing officials (or the designees of the offi-
25	cials) shall serve as ex officio members of the

1 Commission: The Director of the National In-2 stitutes of Health; the Director of the National 3 Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney 4 Diseases; the Director of the National Institute 5 of Allergy and Infectious Diseases; the Director 6 of the National Cancer Institute; the Director 7 of the National Institute of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering; the Director of the Na-8 9 tional Institute of Drug Abuse; the Director of 10 the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Al-11 coholism; the Director of the National Human 12 Genome Research Institute; the Director for the 13 Division of Digestive Diseases and Nutrition 14 within the National Institute of Diabetes and 15 Digestive Kidney Diseases; the Director of the 16 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; the 17 Chief Medical Director of the Department of 18 Veterans Affairs; and the Secretary of Defense. 19 (d) Chair.—From among the appointed members of 20 the Commission, the members of the Commission shall se-21 lect an individual to serve as the Chair of the Commission. 22 (e) TERMS.—The term of a member of the Commis-23 sion is the life of the Commission.

24 (f) Vacancies.—

- 1 (1) AUTHORITY OF COMMISSION.—A vacancy in 2 the membership of the Commission does not affect 3 the power of the remaining members to carry out 4 the duties of the Commission.
- 5 (2) APPOINTMENT OF SUCCESSOR.—A vacancy 6 in the membership of the Commission shall be filled 7 in the manner in which the original appointment was 8 made.
- 9 (3) INCOMPLETE TERM.—If a member of the Commission does not serve the full term of the member, the individual appointed to fill the resulting vacancy shall be appointed for the remainder of the term of the predecessor of the individual.
- 14 (g) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall first meet as 15 directed by the Secretary, not later than sixty days after 16 the Commission is established, and thereafter shall meet 17 at the call of the Chair of the Commission, but not less 18 often than three times during the life of the Commission.
- 19 (h) Compensation; Reimbursement of Ex-20 penses.—
- 21 (1) APPOINTED MEMBERS.—Members of the 22 Commission appointed from among individuals who 23 are not officers or employees of the Federal Govern-24 ment shall receive compensation for each day (in-25 cluding travel time) engaged in carrying out the du-

- ties of the Commission. Such compensation may not be in an amount in excess of the daily equivalent of the annual maximum rate of basic pay payable under section 5108 of title 5, United States Code, for positions above GS-15.
 - (2) EX OFFICIO MEMBERS.—Members of the Commission appointed from among individuals who are officers or employees of the Federal Government may not receive compensation for service on the Commission in addition to the compensation otherwise received for duties carried out as Federal officers or employees.
 - (3) Reimbursement.—Members of the Commission, while serving away from their homes or regular places of business in the performance of services for the Commission, shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in the same manner as such expenses are authorized by section 5703 of title 5, United States Code, for persons in Government service employed intermittently.

(i) Staff.—

(1) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.—The Commission may appoint and fix the pay of an executive director to effectively carry out its functions. The executive director shall be appointed subject to the provisions

- of title 5, United States Code, governing appoint-
- 2 ments in the competitive service, and shall be paid
- 3 in accordance with the provisions of chapter 51 and
- 4 sub-chapter III of chapter 53 of such title related to
- 5 classification and General Schedule pay rates.
- 6 (2) Additional Staff.—The Secretary shall
- 7 provide the Commission with such additional profes-
- 8 sional and clerical staff, such information, and the
- 9 services of such consultants as the Secretary deter-
- mines to be necessary for the Commission to carry
- out effectively its functions.
- 12 (j) Powers.—The Commission may hold such hear-
- 13 ings, take such testimony, and sit and act at such time
- 14 and places as the Commission deems advisable.
- 15 (k) Report.—Within 18 months following its initial
- 16 meetings (as prescribed by subsection (g)), the Commis-
- 17 sion shall publish and transmit directly to the Congress
- 18 a final report respecting its activities under this section.
- 19 The report shall contain—
- 20 (1) the long-range plan required by subsection
- 21 (b)(2);
- 22 (2) the expenditure estimates required by sub-
- section (b)(3); and

1	(3) any recommendations of the Commission for
2	legislation that would facilitate the implementation
3	of the long-range plan.

- In developing recommendations under paragraph (3), the
- Commission shall evaluate the effectiveness of the Inter-
- agency Coordinating Committee for Digestive Diseases 6
- and assess its ability to monitor and promote adherence
- to the long-range plan. The Commission may also make 8
- recommendations regarding organizational changes within
- the National Institutes of Health or the establishment of 10
- new entities that would facilitate implementation of the
- long-range plan and otherwise coordinate the Federal di-
- 13 gestive diseases research effort.

- 14 (1) TERMINATION.—The Commission terminates 30
- 15 days after the date on which the final report under sub-
- section (k) is submitted to the Congress. 16
- 17 (m) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For the
- purpose of carrying out this section, there is authorized 18
- to be appropriated \$4,000,000 in the aggregate for fiscal
- 20 years 2005 and 2006.

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
