AN ACT

To amend the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 to increase the maximum amount of an award available under the Department of State rewards program, to expand the eligibility criteria to receive an award, to authorize nonmonetary awards, to publicize the existence of the rewards program, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Counter-Terrorist and
5	Narco-Terrorist Rewards Program Act".
6	SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF STATE COUNTER-TERRORIST AND
7	NARCO-TERRORIST REWARDS PROGRAM.
8	(a) Disruption of Foreign Terrorist Financ-
9	ING NETWORK.—Subsection (b) of section 36 of the State
10	Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (22 U.S.C.
11	2708) is amended—
12	(1) in paragraph (5) by striking "or" at the
13	end;
14	(2) in paragraph (6) by striking the period and
15	inserting "; or"; and
16	(3) by adding at the end the following new
17	paragraph:
18	"(7) the disruption of financial mechanisms of
19	a foreign terrorist organization, including the use by
20	the organization of illicit narcotics production or
21	international narcotics trafficking—
22	"(A) to finance acts of international ter-
23	rorism; or
24	"(B) to sustain or support any terrorist or-
25	ganization.".

1	(b) Maximum Amount of Reward.—Subsection
2	(e)(1) of such section is amended—
3	(1) by striking "\$5,000,000" and inserting
4	``\$25,000,000``;
5	(2) by striking the second period at the end;
6	and
7	(3) by adding at the end the following new sen-
8	tence: "Without first making such determination,
9	the Secretary may authorize a reward of up to twice
10	the amount specified in this paragraph for the cap-
11	ture or information leading to the capture of a lead-
12	er of a foreign terrorist organization.".
13	(c) Clarification of Existing Authority.—Sub-
14	section (e) of such section is amended by adding at the
15	end the following new paragraph:
16	"(6) Forms of Reward Payment.—The Sec-
17	retary may make a reward under this section in the
18	form of money, a nonmonetary item (including such
19	items as automotive vehicles), or a combination
20	thereof.".
21	(d) Media Surveys and Advertisements.—Such
22	section is amended—
23	(1) by redesignating subsections (i) and (j) as
24	subsections (j) and (k), respectively; and

- 1 (2) by inserting after subsection (h) the following new subsection:
 - "(i) Media Surveys and Advertisements.—

- "(1) Surveys conducted.—For the purpose of more effectively disseminating information about the rewards program, the Secretary may use the resources of the rewards program to conduct media surveys, including analyses of media markets, means of communication, and levels of literacy, in countries determined by the Secretary to be associated with acts of international terrorism.
- "(2) Creation and purchase of advertiseMents.—The Secretary may use the resources of
 the rewards program to create advertisements to disseminate information about the rewards program.
 The Secretary may base the content of such advertisements on the findings of the surveys conducted
 under paragraph (1). The Secretary may purchase
 radio or television time, newspaper space, or make
 use of any other means of advertisement, as appropriate.".
- (e) Plan of Action.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to the Committee on International Relations of the House of Representatives and the Com-

- 1 mittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate a plan to maxi-
- 2 mize awareness of the reward available under section 36
- 3 of the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956
- 4 (22 U.S.C. 2708 et seq.) for the capture or information
- 5 leading to the capture of a leader of a foreign terrorist
- 6 organization who may be in Pakistan or Afghanistan. The
- 7 Secretary may use the resources of the rewards program
- 8 to prepare the plan.
