- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Deficit Accountability
- 5 Act of 2004".

1 SEC. 2. EFFECT OF A BUDGET DEFICIT.

- 2 Section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act
- 3 of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31) is amended—
- 4 (1) in paragraph (2)(A), by striking "Subject to
- 5 subparagraph (B)," and inserting "Subject to sub-
- 6 paragraph (B) and paragraph (3),"; and
- 7 (2) by adding at the end the following:
- 8 "(3) An adjustment under paragraph (2) otherwise
- 9 scheduled to take effect in a calendar year shall not be
- 10 made if, as determined by the Office of Management and
- 11 Budget, there was a deficit (as defined by section 3 of
- 12 the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act
- 13 of 1974) in the preceding fiscal year.".
