For the relief of the heirs of Henry D. Espy of St. Louis, Missouri.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN LOSSES FOR THE
- 4 HEIRS OF HENRY D. ESPY OF ST. LOUIS, MIS-
- 5 **SOURI.**
- 6 (a) Definition.—In this section, the term "heirs of
- 7 Henry D. Espy' means Mary Espy, Mary Espy Rhodes
- 8 Hoover, Frances Espy Rankin, Jeannette Espy Burton,
- 9 Mark Espy, Damon Espy, Jamisette Espy, Ashley Espy,
- 10 Luke Espy, Reuben Gresham, Melanie Espy, Jasmine
- 11 Espy, Jake Espy, Jeanne Hoover, Robert Hoover, Harold

- 1 Logan, Andrew Logan, Minda Logan, Andrew Logan II,
- 2 Gabrielle Logan, Justin Logan, and Randall Rhodes
- 3 Logan.
- 4 (b) Payment.—The Secretary of the Treasury shall
- 5 pay, using funds in the Treasury not otherwise appro-
- 6 priated, to the heirs of Henry D. Espy of St. Louis, Mis-
- 7 souri, as their interests may appear, an amount equal to
- 8 the difference between—
- 9 (1) the fair market value of land owned by
- 10 Henry D. Espy located in Gifford, Indian River
- 11 County, Florida, that was taken by the United
- 12 States in an eminent domain proceeding in 1942, as
- determined by an appraisal satisfactory to the Sec-
- retary and the heirs of Henry D. Espy; and
- 15 (2) sums already paid by the United States to
- 16 Henry D. Espy in connection with such taking.
- 17 (c) Settlement.—The payment under subsection
- 18 (b) shall be in full settlement of all claims of the heirs
- 19 of Henry D. Espy arising from the 1942 taking referred
- 20 to in such subsection.
- 21 (d) No Inference of Liability.—Nothing in this
- 22 section shall be construed as an inference of liability on
- 23 the part of the United States.
- 24 (e) Limitation on Agents' and Attorneys'
- 25 Fees.—Any contract to the contrary notwithstanding, no

- 1 more than ten percent of the payment required by sub-
- 2 section (b) may be paid to or received by any agent or
- 3 attorney for services rendered in connection with obtaining
- 4 such payment. Any person who violates this subsection
- 5 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to
- 6 a fine in the amount provided in title 18, United States

7 Code.
