Mr. BROWN of South Carolina introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to make beach nourishment projects eligible for inclusion in mitigation plans and for hazard mitigation assistance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MITIGATION PLANNING.**

4 Section 322 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief
5 and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5165) is
6 amended by adding at the end the following:

7 “(f) ELIGIBILITY OF BEACH NOURISHMENT
8 PROJECTS.—Beach nourishment projects that meet such

1 standards as the Secretary of the Army may establish
2 shall be eligible for inclusion in a mitigation plan as an
3 action to mitigate hazards, risks, and vulnerabilities iden-
4 tified under a mitigation plan developed under this sec-
5 tion.”.

6 **SEC. 2. HAZARD MITIGATION.**

7 Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief
8 and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170c) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following:

10 “(d) ELIGIBILITY OF BEACH NOURISHMENT
11 PROJECTS.—Beach nourishment projects that meet such
12 standards as the Secretary of the Army may establish
13 shall be treated for purposes of this section as hazard miti-
14 gation measures which are cost effective and substantially
15 reduce the risk of future damage, hardship, loss or suf-
16 fering in an area affected by a major disaster and shall
17 be eligible for assistance under this section.”.
