A BILL

To authorize appropriations for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2005, to amend various laws administered by the Coast Guard, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be referred to as the "Coast Guard Au-
3	thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005".
4	SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
5	Funds are authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year
6	2005 for necessary expenses of the Coast Guard as follows:
7	(1) For the operation and maintenance of the
8	Coast Guard, \$5,212,220,000, of which \$25,000,000 is
9	authorized to be derived from the Oil Spill Liability
10	Trust Fund to carry out the purposes of section
11	1012(a)(5) of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990.
12	(2) For the acquisition, construction, rebuilding,
13	and improvement of aids to navigation, shore and off-
14	shore facilities, vessels, and aircraft, including equip-
15	ment related thereto, \$1,528,494,000, of which—
16	(A) \$23,500,000 is authorized to be derived
17	from the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund to carry
18	out the purposes of section 1012(a)(5) of the Oil
19	Pollution Act of 1990; and
20	(B) \$1,100,000,000 is authorized for acqui-
21	sition and construction of shore and offshore fa-
22	cilities, vessels, and aircraft, including equip-
23	ment related thereto, and other activities that
24	constitute the Integrated Deepwater System pro-
25	gram.

- (3) For research, development, test, and evaluation of technologies, materials, and human factors directly relating to improving the performance of the Coast Guard's mission in search and rescue, aids to navigation, marine safety, marine environmental protection, enforcement of laws and treaties, ice operations, oceanographic research, and defense readiness, \$18,500,000, to remain available until expended, of which \$3,500,000 is authorized to be derived from the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund to carry out the purposes of section 1012(a)(5) of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990.
 - (4) For retired pay (including payment of obligations otherwise chargeable to lapsed appropriations for this purpose), payments under the Retired Serviceman's Family Protection and Survivor Benefit Plans, and payments for medical care of retired personnel and their dependents under chapter 55 of title 10, United States Code, \$1,085,460,000.
 - (5) For alteration or removal of bridges over navigable waters of the United States constituting obstructions to navigation, and for personnel and administrative costs associated with the Bridge Alteration Program, \$19,136,000, to remain available until expended.

1	(6) For environmental compliance and restora-
2	tion at Coast Guard facilities (other than parts and
3	equipment associated with operation and mainte-
4	nance), \$17,000,000, to remain available until ex-
5	pended.
6	(7) For maintenance and operation of facilities,
7	supplies, equipment, and services necessary for the
8	Coast Guard Reserve, as authorized by law,
9	\$117,000,000.
10	SEC. 3. AUTHORIZED LEVELS OF MILITARY STRENGTH AND
11	TRAINING.
12	(a) Active Duty Strength.—The Coast Guard is
13	authorized an end-of-year strength for active duty personnel
14	of 45,500 as of September 30, 2005.
15	(b) Military Training Student Loads.—The Coast
16	Guard is authorized average military training student
17	loads as follows:
18	(1) For recruit and special training for fiscal
19	year 2005, 2,500 student years.
20	(2) For flight training for fiscal year 2005, 125
21	student years.
22	(3) For professional training in military and ci-
23	vilian institutions for fiscal year 2005, 350 student
24	years.

- 1 (4) For officer acquisition for fiscal year 2005,
- 2 1,200 student years.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to authorize appropriations and military strength and training levels for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2005.".
