A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 **SECTION 1. FINDING.**
- 4 The Congress finds that an official website of the
- 5 Saudi Arabian Government's Supreme Commission for
- 6 Tourism included the following text:

1	"Visas will not be issued for the following
2	groups of people:
3	"An Israeli passport holder or a passport
4	that has an Israeli arrival/departure stamp.
5	"Those who don't abide by the Saudi tra-
6	ditions concerning appearance and behaviors.
7	Those under the influence of alcohol will not be
8	permitted into the Kingdom.
9	"There are certain regulations for pilgrims
10	and you should contact the consulate for more
11	information.
12	"Jewish People."
13	SEC. 2. CESSATION OF VISA ISSUANCE.
14	Beginning on the day after the date of the enactment
15	of this Act, no visa shall be issued by the Government of
16	the United States to a citizen of Saudi Arabia until the
17	President certifies that the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia does
