A BILL

For the relief of Thomas W. Sikes and Wellington Trade, Inc., doing business as Containerhouse.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. COMPENSATION FOR DAMAGES.
- 4 (a) In General.—The Secretary of the Treasury
- 5 shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
- 6 appropriated, \$1,500,000 to the persons named in sub-
- 7 section (b) for damages sustained by such persons in con-
- 8 nection with a 1991 government contract for the purchase
- 9 and delivery of certain ocean freight containers.

- (b) Persons to Receive Compensation.—The
 Secretary of the Treasury shall compensate the following
 persons under subsection (a):
 (1) Thomas W. Sikes of Cadwell, Georgia.
- 5 (2) Wellington Trade Inc., of Cornelia, Georgia,
- 6 doing business as Containerhouse.

7 SEC. 2. SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED

- 8 STATES.
- 9 Payment under section 1 shall constitute full settle-
- 10 ment of all legal and equitable claims by the persons
- 11 named in section 1(b) against the United States for the
- 12 damages described in section 1(a).

13 SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON ATTORNEY AND AGENT FEES.

- Not more than 10 percent of the payment made
- 15 under section 1 may be paid to or received by an agent
- 16 or attorney as consideration for any service rendered in
- 17 connection with this Act. Each violation of this section is
- 18 punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.
